

Best of Boston & Spooky Salem



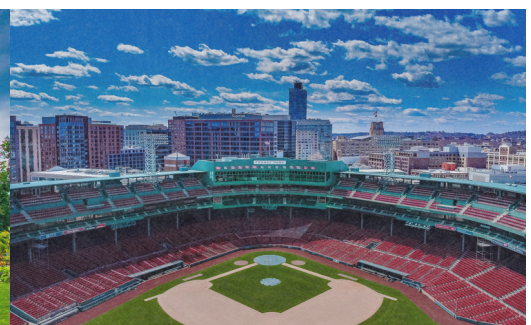

Sunday, October 4th – Today we'll fly into Logan Airport and meet our local guide at our hotel perfectly situated in the heart of **Boston's Seaport District**. Known for its luxurious amenities and stylish design, our hotel offers easy access to many of Boston's top attractions. After settling in, we'll kick off our adventure with a beer tasting at the renowned **Sam Adams Brewery**, where we can savor a variety of craft beers paired with a delicious pretzel. We'll conclude our evening with dinner at a beloved local favorite, immersing ourselves in Boston's vibrant culinary scene and a **sunset cruise**. **(D)**

Monday, October 5th – We'll start our day with a delightful breakfast in the city before departing for the Olde Town Trolley. Your narrated street trolley tour will cover over 100 historical points, including along the Freedom Trail. After the tour we'll have lunch on our own at **Faneuil Hall**, a bustling hub filled with diverse food options. In the afternoon, we'll enjoy some sightseeing, taking in stunning views of the skyline and historical landmarks. We'll visit the **Paul Revere House and Museum and The Old North Church**, diving deeper into Boston's rich history. The **Boston Tea Party Ship** is our next stop. Our day will conclude with a delightful **Italian dinner in the North End**, known for its vibrant dining scene and delicious cuisine. **(B,D)**

Tuesday, October 6th – Established in 1982, this is **Salem's Original trolley. Enjoy Tales & Tombstones**, a one-hour narrated historical tour. **Salem Witch Museum** follows the history of witches, witchcraft, and witch hunts through the ages. Then we have an appointment at **Gallows Hill**, and we'll be immersed in a thrilling theatrical experience. This live **Witchcraft & Ghost Experience** is guaranteed to be the most exciting event we will see. Late afternoon we visit the House of Seven Gables, which constitutes its own national historic district on the National Register. **Dinner and a ferry ride** back to Boston concludes our day spent in Salem. This unique historic city is unforgettable in October. **(B,D)**

Wednesday, October 7th – We'll begin our day with breakfast in the city, followed by a "Back of the House" tour of **Fenway Park** with a knowledgeable local Boston guide. This walking tour will give us an exclusive look at America's oldest ballpark, home of the Boston Red Sox. After the tour, we'll have lunch on our own in the vibrant **Kenmore Square** area, known for its diverse dining options. Our afternoon will be packed with more iconic Boston sights including the stunning **Trinity Church**, the historic **Boston Public Library**, and a unique experience at the **Christian Science Center**, where you will be surrounded by an extraordinary three-story stained glass globe. We'll wrap up the day with dinner on our own. **(B)**

Thursday, October 8th – We'll spend our final day in **Cambridge** with a visit to the **Longfellow House** and a **Tour of Harvard** with a current student. After lunch we visit the new **MIT Museum**, where we explore state-of-the-art current projects showcasing science, technology, and innovation from one of the world's leading research institutions. After the tour, we'll enjoy our farewell dinner with friends, **(B,D)**

Friday, October 9th – This morning we enjoy breakfast and make our way to the airport for our flights home, concluding our unforgettable journey through Boston.
