August 17-20, 2026

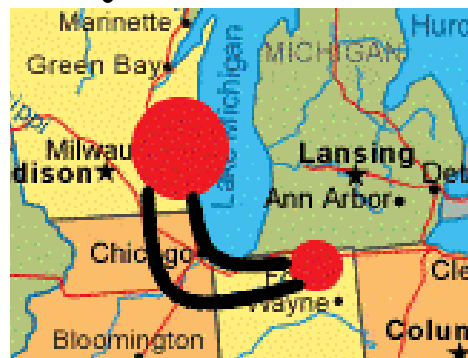

Monday, August 17 - Off we go on a fun excursion in Indiana's Amish Country! As we drive towards Indiana, our tour director helps us get to know our newfound friends. We arrive early afternoon for a delicious lunch known at the "Haystack." Then we will climb aboard for a wagon ride at **Dutch Creek Farm Animal Park**. A wide variety of exotic and farm animals will be eager to eat right out of your hand on this tour of the farm by horse-drawn carriage. Our final shop is the **Dutch Country Market** followed by **Carolyn's Kitchen** - a local Amish jam maker - where we will be delighted with a private tasting of her creations. After a full day of exploring and shopping, we return to our hotel for time to relax before dinner. Our interactive meal tonight includes a wagon ride at the **Bison Ranch**.
