Phoenix, Arizona

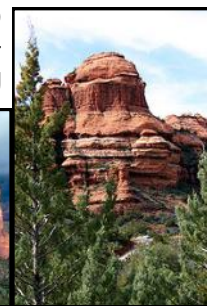

Spend a day in the Sedona area, taking in the gorgeous scenery of the red rock spires and venturing out on an off-road jeep tour. Return to the Old West at Tortilla Flats and sail serenely on beautiful Canyon Lake aboard the Dolly Steamboat. Come, join us!

WEDNESDAY MARCH 14



The day has arrived. We are off to the airport and our early flight to Phoenix, allowing us to take advantage of a full day in sunny Arizona. An excursion to Sedona and Oak Creek Canyon, north of Phoenix, is planned for today. We board our van and midday finds us arriving in **Sedona**. Often called "Red Rock Country", this picturesque city is surrounded by red rock monoliths, and on its north side is

stunning Oak Creek Canyon. Get set for a real adventure as we board our **pink jeep and go off-roading** on a trip that will take us on and over the red rocks while the magnificent canyon walls surround us. Sedona is also a Mecca for hundreds of artists of every medium. We will have free time to explore, finding lunch along the way, and perhaps a few treasures. Leaving Sedona, we follow the 12-mile river gorge through scenic **Oak Creek Canyon**.



At the north end our van ascends the canyon wall via a series of switchbacks. Returning to suburban Phoenix, we check into the hotel, our home away from home for the next 5 nights. A light supper is planned for tonight at the hotel including adult beverages. **(LS)**

THURSDAY MARCH 15



Our day begins as a **local guide joins us for a tour of Phoenix**. She shares historical facts and points out noteworthy landmarks as we drive through the downtown area. Next we head to **Surprise Stadium** for a contest between the Brewers and the **Texas Rangers**. Finding ourselves hoarse from cheering, we return to the hotel for beverages and a light supper. **(B, LS)**

FRIDAY MARCH 16

First on our agenda this morning, is a visit to the **Desert Botanical Garden**. From our docent we learn the unique characteristics of desert plants and how they are adapted to survive and thrive in a harsh desert environment. Make sure you don your blue and gold as we travel to **Goodyear Ballpark** for a game against the **Cincinnati Reds**. A light supper and beverages are again provided at the hotel. **(B, LS)**





**SATURDAY
MARCH 17**

Today we experience our third spring training game. This time it is against the **Colorado Rockies** at **Maryvale Baseball Park**, the Brewers home field. However, before the first ball is pitched we bring a traditional **"Miller Park tailgate party"** to Arizona. Showing Arizonans how it is done, we grill hamburgers and brats and serve them with all of the trimmings. After the wonderful cookout at noon, all we will need this evening is a light supper and maybe a cocktail. **(B, L, LS)**

**SUNDAY
MARCH 18**

Our ventures today take us along the historic **Apache Trail** (Route 88) through the Superstition Mountains to **Tortilla Flat**. A former stagecoach stop, Tortilla Flat is the smallest official "community" in Arizona with a population of 6 people. We experience their hospitality as lunch is in this interesting spot. Next on our agenda is a cruise on beautiful **Canyon Lake** aboard the **Dolly Steamboat**. Make sure you have plenty of battery life in your camera to capture the



views as the desert butts up to the blue waters of the lake. It is not uncommon to see big-horn sheep, coyote, deer, bobcats, mountain lions and bald eagles. Later we spend time at **Goldfield Ghost Town** where we have an opportunity to pan for gold and ride Arizona's only narrow gauge train. On our way back into Phoenix, we stop at the **Rockin' R Ranch** for a traditional cowboy dinner with all the trimmin's in this Wild West Town. **(B, D)**



**MONDAY
MARCH 19**



This morning we visit the **Hall of Flame Fire Museum and National Firefighting Hall of Heroes**. The museum is comprised of almost an acre of fire history exhibits and over 90 fully restored pieces of fire apparatus, dating from 1725 to 1969. The National Firefighting Hall of Heroes honors firefighters who have died in the line of duty or have been decorated for heroism. After five glorious days in sunny Arizona and three exciting Brewers games, we transfer to the

airport for our homeward flight. The flight gives us time to reflect on the fun we had and the new friends we made. Our arrival at Milwaukee International Airport is scheduled for early evening. **(B)**
